



## **EPA OK's Added Ethanol in Car Fuel**

Nearly two thirds of drivers could have more corn-based ethanol in their fuel tanks under a new Environmental Agency Decision. The agency said that 15 percent ethanol blended with gasoline is safe for cars and light duty trucks manufactured between 2001 and 2006, expanding an October decision that the higher blend is safe for cars built since 2007. The maximum gasoline blend has been 10 percent ethanol.

The fuel is popular in farm country because most ethanol comes from corn and other grains. It faces strong opposition, however, from the auto industry, environmentalists, cattle ranchers, food companies and a broad coalition of other groups. Those groups say that using corn to make ethanol makes animal feed more expensive, raises prices at the grocery store and tears up the land. There have already been several lawsuits filed against the EPA – including one filed by automakers, boat manufacturers and outdoor power equipment manufacturers. – since the agency decided to allow the higher blends for newer cars in October.

Critics said the change could be frustrating for drivers of older cars who will have to figure out which service station pump to use. And they argue that many retailers will opt not to sell the higher blend because of the expense of adding new pumps and signs.

“It seems like the corn growers and the ethanol industries are the only real winners here”, said Craig Cox of the Environmental Working Group, an advocacy group that opposes use of the fuel.

## No Drips Allowed By Ralph Wethli



### Trials and Tribulations of a Do-It-Your Self Mechanic:

My 66 Mustang developed a very small drip from the power steering pump. It may have dripped less than ½ cup in a year. I am intolerant of malfunctions and the stain on the garage floor irritated me. The pump and its reservoir are integral, on Fords P.S pump, sealed together with an “O” Ring. It was the source of the drip. I bought a pump seal kit which included the offending “O” Ring. To replace it required removing the pump from the car. No big deal, say’s I. A pressure hose, a return hose, its drive belt and 4 mounting bolts, easy enough. But once all above was removed, the pump is loose but will not come past the A/C compressor, which is mounted above the pump. Much study and trials convinced me that the A/C compressor had to be removed. This usually results in the loss of the Freon charge. To Ford’s credit they had, in those years, a service port whereby you can isolate the main A/C system and lose only the charge in the compressor and this was my course of action. After removing all mounting hardware, the compressor with its mount, is attached to the engine on one inch studs. Meaning that the assembly must be pulled forward one inch to clear the studs for removal.

I pulled forward, but before it could clear the one inch studs, the compressor contacted the radiator fan. So now the fan has to be removed. To remove the fan its shroud has to be removed, to remove the shroud the upper radiator hose must be removed! This is starting to take the edge off my day! And all this for One Little Drip! I’m beginning to question, which of us is The Bigger Drip?

Once removed to the bench the pump “O” ring replacement was simple. Good time to clean and paint. Every thing reassembled in reverse order all went well and no more “DRIPS”.

In industry they always think in terms of “Cost Affective”. I pretty well fractured that rule. There was the price of the seal kit, nearly a quart of power steering fluid and of course the evacuation and recharge of the A/C compressor. The total amount would have paid for about 20 years of power steering fluid, at the current “Rip” rate. I’ll just call it the price of Victory or “The Agony” and “The Ecstasy”.
