## Death of a Pony

*FLMC member has horrific accident, member ok, car not so much...*

April 5, 2013, started out like any other day, FLMC board member and *Pony Express* Editor, Bruce Solov; get up, go to work, come home, the usual things.

After work, Solov was asked to meet a friend for dinner up in Delray Beach, so he got in his 2004 Mustang Convertible, and headed on his way. The weather that day had rain on and off, all day long, so putting the top down was not an option for the drive to Delray.



The drive started out uneventful, was fully focused on the road, and was going the posted speed limit. The road was a little wet from the rain earlier in the day but nothing to cause concern. As he passed Exit 81 on the Florida Turnpike, North, the left rear tire blew out, and sent him and his car into a spin, crossing several lanes of traffic. "I saw my whole life flash before me," Solov said. "I thought I was a goner." After the car spun five or six times, it came to rest after hitting a concrete barrier. No other cars were involved, and Solov was slightly hurt with a mild head injury. He was transported to West Boca Medical Center, by ambulance where he was treated and released. He was lucky to be alive. That is the happy part.

His, prized possession, his 2004 Convertible, not so lucky. The car was completely destroyed.

The car was loaded onto a flat bed and towed away to a tow lot up in Delray Beach. A Florida Highway Patrol Officer took the accident report and a statement from Solov, before he was taken to the hospital for treatment.

The car was deemed to be a total loss, and Solov had to sell the car to a junk yard in order to pay the three days of storage fees plus the towing fees that were incurred.

"I am lucky to be alive," he said. "But I miss my Pony dearly." Currently he is using a family member's car to be able to get around. But, he knows that sometime soon, he will have another Pony.
